PHOTOGRAPHY: VIEWFINDER

Most cameras have a viewfinder—a small square of glass that you look through to compose or focus the subject of what will be included in the photograph.

The viewfinder makes a frame for your photo, and helps you decide where you want your main subject to be—at the center, or the bottom, or elsewhere in the picture.

Cut the center circle out of the camera image below, then look through your paper viewfinder to create different compositions in the world around you.
