Teaching Artist – Independent Contractor Opportunity

Position Summary

The Georgia O’Keeffe Museum is in search of Teaching Artists to plan and facilitate adult studio art classes via Zoom and in person. Artists will be responsible for lesson planning, workshop facilitation, set up, providing any external material for attendees (pictures, example artwork, slideshows, etc.), and clean up.

Workshops can be any medium, or mixed media, and designed for varying levels of experience (e.g. beginner or intermediate classes). Classes should be designed to introduce students to a medium or technique (beginner), help teach participants how to better their technique (intermediate) while also tying back to the core values of the Georgia O’Keeffe Museum and Georgia O’Keeffe’s artistic vision. Attendees should leave each class feeling that they have learned something new and feeling accomplished with the work they have produced.

Background and Qualifications

- BA/BFA - Art, art history, museum studies, art education, or another humanities degree – Required
- 2-3 Years’ experience teaching studio art making techniques - Required
- 2-3 Years’ experience as a professional artist; experience may substitute a Bachelor’s degree - Required
- 2-3 Years’ experience designing, teaching, and facilitating art classes for adults - Preferred

- Studio art experience
- Strong interpersonal and problem-solving skills
- Ability to connect with adult audiences
